Quick Tip: Getting Great Sound for Your Online Music Lessons!

With inclement weather, the studio will sometimes move to a virtual format so that the musical learning can continue.

Our virtual lessons & classes are conducted via the Zoom platform.


To make sure your instrument sounds crystal clear and you get the best experience, there are a couple of small settings we recommend checking in Zoom. This helps Zoom understand that you're making music, not just talking!

Here's how to set it up:

Part 1: One-Time Setup in Zoom Settings (Desktop/Laptop)

You only need to do this once!

1. **Open Zoom Settings:** Open the Zoom **app** on your computer, click your **profile picture** (top-right), and then click **Settings** (the gear icon 🔆).



- Go to Audio & Uncheck Auto Adjust: Click on "Audio" from the left menu. Then, uncheck the box that says "Automatically adjust microphone volume." You can leave the slider where it is, or adjust it later if needed.
- Enable "Original sound for musicians": Scroll down a little to find "Audio Profile" or "Microphone modes". Select "Original sound for musicians".
 Then, make sure to CHECK "High-fidelity music mode" and UNCHECK "Echo

cancellation." If you have a stereo microphone, you can also CHECK "Stereo audio."

Part 2: Turning on Original Sound During Every Lesson

This is the only thing you need to do each time you join!

- 1. **Join Your Lesson:** Once you're in the Zoom meeting, look for a green check mark button in the **top-right corner** of the meeting window.
- 2. Click to Turn ON: Click the button that says "Original Sound for Musicians: Off". It should then change to say "Original Sound for Musicians: On". Now you're ready to make some music!
